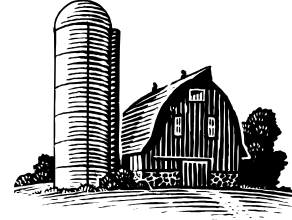

C.S.I meets Geneology

This is a very complex and easily confusing subject. For the non lab scientists here is a quick explanation of some of the terminology.

Allele Result: the numeric value assigned to a genetic marker.

AKA marker value

Autosomal DNA: all of your DNA except for what is on your X and Y chromosomes.

Biogeographical test: an autosomal DNA test that estimates percentages of your geographical origins – Native

American/Canadian, Sub-Saharan, African, East Indian and European.

Haplogroup: an identification of the genetic group your ancient ancestors belonged to (10 000 to 60 000 years ago)

Mitochondrial DNA (mtDNA): genetic material that mothers pass on to their children

Y-DNA: genetic material that fathers pass on to their sons

Kits can be ordered online with instructions, a swab to painlessly scrape cell from the inside of your cheek, a return envelope and a consent form.

Most of the work is done in a lab and you just have to be patient waiting for the results.
